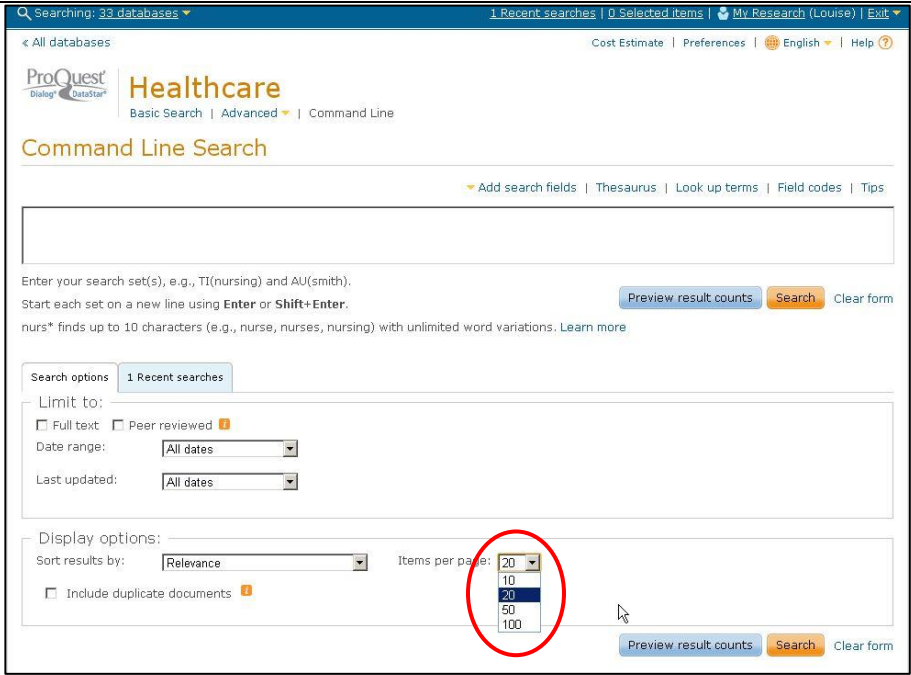


VIEWING RESULTS

Set the number of records per page

TASK: There are several ways to change the number of records displayed on the Results page. On the Advanced and Command Line Search pages you can use a drop list to specify the number of records up to 100 displayed for the current session. With a My Research account you can click Preferences to set the number of records displayed permanently.

1. In **Command Line Search** under **Display options > Items per page**, choose the number of records you wish to display throughout the current session.



In **Advanced Search** scroll down to **Items per page** toward the bottom of the page and use the drop list to specify the number of records you wish to display during the current session.



2. On the **Results** page scroll down to the bottom of the page to find a drop list for **Items per page**.



3. Use the **Items per page** drop list to specify the number of records you wish to display during the current session.
